
Author Solves Old Bombay Mystery?



When Nev March was a girl growing up in Mumbai, her protective parents wouldn't let her leave the house alone because "bad things might happen." Words such as murder or rape were never used. Instead, her parents cited the death of two Parsi teenagers who fell to their deaths, falling from Rajabai Clock Tower at Bombay University. Because of the repetition of the story, young Nev thought this was a recent event. Only later did she learn this tragic incident actually occurred back in the 1890s, during the British occupation. She remained curious about this decades-old, unsolved crime.


In 1991, Nev came to the United States, married and eventually settled in New Jersey. Over the years, she developed a love of writing. She now teaches creative writing at Rutgers University's Osher Institute.

In 2017, she decided to solve the mystery, even if only fictionally. To solve the case based on real-life, she invented the fictional character of "Captain Jim" Agnihotri, a biracial soldier who loves Sherlock Holmes. And thus, her mystery novel Murder in Old Bombay was born.

Nev submitted her manuscript to the Mystery Writers of America and won a publishing contract from Minotaur Books. She is the first Indian-born author to win the Mystery Writers of America award for First Crime Novel. *Murder in Old Bombay* has been nominated for five national awards, including the Edgar and Anthony Awards, the Barry, Macavity and Hammet awards for excellence in Crime Fiction.

Her second "Captain Jim" mystery novel, *Peril at the Exposition*, has been accepted for publication in August 2022.





