





# Michael Stephen Daigle, Man of Mystery

Michael Daigle, author of the popular Frank Nagler mystery series, set in New Jersey, sat down with *Book Lovers Dispatch* for a fascinating look into his writing process and what he's working on next. Reflecting on his series of six books (so far), Michael talked about having "just plain fun" creating the world and evolving the characters. He continues to be surprised by the twists and surprises that come with writing. Michael has more Frank Nagler books on their way, and is considering new possibilities, including one story set in an old hotel in a small town in Maine.

In addition to having fun, Michael talked about being in the writing zone. He compares it to being in a sports zone, where muscle memory takes over and writing becomes instinctive. He emphasizes the importance of getting past physical blocks and not being hindered by spelling or details initially, they can be fixed later. Instead, he focuses on immersing himself in the setting and characters, allowing the story to unfold naturally. He highlights the thrill of discovery during writing, acknowledging that sometimes he needs to backtrack or make unexpected turns in the plot.

So where do his clever twists and plots come from? Michael finds inspiration in reading, real-life






experiences, and the fascination of places. His favorite books to read and reread seem to be anything written by someone named John: John Updike, John Cheever, John Gardner. He admires John McPhee's ability to frame stories effectively. Note that he also recommends *The Book Thief* and *Bridge of Clay* by Markus Zusak and the books by mystery writer Walter Mosley.














